Curriculum / Changes from September

The last few months have seen much improvement to our school curriculum. In the new academic year from September and every following term thereafter, you will receive a newsletter outlining all the 'enquiry questions' that your child will answer throughout their learning topics.

Typical enquiry questions to answer may be: 'Why don't I fall off the bottom of the world?', 'What is evolution?', 'Can matter change?' or, 'How was crime punished in Britain across the centuries?'

Our focus is to help your children understand how Britain came to be as it is today, and to begin to develop and build upon a love of the scientific and technological society we live in. We aim to educate them about the environment, renewable energy and care for all groups within our society. We will also learn about how Eastbourne itself has evolved so that the children have an understanding about the history of where they live and their immediate community; something we, as a Trust, are hugely proud of and continue to embed within our school communities.

In the next week or so the new curriculum roadmaps will be uploaded onto our website for you to see. Improvements to content and navigation of our school website will begin in the new academic year, and I will keep you informed as changes are implemented.

Needless to say, our guests have had a very busy and thorough visit, which they have enjoyed immensely. The teachers even had the opportunity to interview me, as Headteacher, asking lots of questions about what the job entails – I was sure not to put them off! In all seriousness, it has been a pleasure to host our colleagues and they have been highly complimentary about our school.

A number of parents have enquired about the purchase of uniform from our current suppliers. Specifically, they have queried why the new logo does not appear on our school jumpers and whether this will change in the near future.
