Dear Parents/Carers,

Happy December and I'm so pleased to be back at school, working with you all. We are already two terms into the school year and the children are hard at work, learning lots of new things. Our new curriculum is being well taught and when talking to and questioning children about their learning, their answers are stunning.

If asked, our Year 6 learners could explain clearly how the heart pumps oxygenated blood to the muscles through the circulatory system. They previously visited our trust secondary school, Ratton, making use of their large Science labs to dissect an actual animal heart. In geography they have also discussed and explored whether our oceans are healthy and if they're not, why? Year 5 learners could explain what a megacity is and can name some of the megacities around the world. In Year 4 learners have discussed weather and climate and can tell us about different climates around the planet. Year 3 are currently learning about life in Britain during the Iron Age. They are asking how we know about history and the lives of people thousands of years ago.

Our new Year 3 children have shown how to be Ocklynge learners. They have settled very well and are a polite, mature and lovely year group. We are so pleased to have them as part of our school. They have focused their learning around using maps and satellite photos to identify places and even create their own maps. We hope that the curriculum letters sent to you all in September and November are providing you with sufficient information, allowing you to explore what is being taught in school and further engage with your children at home.

As started in October, moving forward, every half term we will be inviting all of our parents/carers into school to attend our Open Events, an opportunity to share the learning taking place within the classroom. Each teacher will alert parents to the day and timings of their event. With 24 classes these will obviously need to be on different times and days. We are trying to be sympathetic to those of you with twins (there are 6 lots of them in school!) and hope not to always clash with the other twin's class. Earlier in the year, large parts of our school were redecorated and renovated. The school looks fresh and clean in many areas, and we continue to ensure this is the case. We are now less than two weeks away from the Christmas break. The children's excitement is tangible, and we all look forward to the festive holiday.
