

Is That Your... KS2: 7-11 YEARS

The KS1 titles regarding passwords, the internet and search engines can also be revisited.

Age group of learner	KS2/7-11 years

This session is designed to take no more than 30 minutes. However, the session can be shortened or lengthened over a number of days depending on your setting. Each activity could be completed on a different day over a week.

Session t	itle	Is That Your		
Outcome	for the session	 Children will be aware of the decisions they make using technology. Children will make safer decisions online. 		
Extension activities How will you know the children are learning?		 Children will make saler decisions online. This is a session all about talk and discussion. Teachers could put together a 'Using Tech Safely' board in their room. There is some opportunity for songs and raps to be made with the key messages. Children will show understanding through questioning and participation. In the longer term, it will be evident that the children change the way they search or set passwords. 		
Time	Activity	Resource	Outcome	
2 mins	Question (dependent on title): What do we mean by Digital Footprint? What is a social network? What is the purpose of social networks?	PPT.	Children establish the focus area of the session and have a collective understanding of the terms.	





20 mins	Run through the slides in the PowerPoint. There are questions to ask on the notes for each slide (see handout). Give children a chance to talk to each other and discuss each question.	PPT. Handout. Let the discussion flow away from these questions if necessary.	Children talk about their use of technology and begin to understand the safest decisions to make online.
5 mins	Ask the children for one thing they are going to do differently as a result of this session.		Children make a decision about one way they will improve their safe use of technology.
Extension 1	Using Tech Safely Board. If you have a spare display board it is a good idea to get the children to write down one commitment on a piece of paper (shape it like a monitor, mouse, mobile etc) and display all their commitments on the wall. Over time this will build to a powerful display for the way children will use technology in a safer way.		
Extension 2	Choose a well known song or nursery rhyme and work with the children to change the lyrics to fit an online safety message. This is an example from Anson Primary School in Brent. Stay Safe Online: <u>https://youtu.be/4xCkBJu_IZY</u>	Access to YouTube Song lyrics. Recording device.	Children apply their 'using tech safely' knowledge. Children share their work to help other children stay safe.
